Preview:-

- ❖ Welcome Address: -Smt. Baby Dutta Choudhury, Asst. Prof. of Special Education, NSOU presented welcome address. Smt. Baby Dutta chowdhury, Asst. Prof., in her Welcome address, delivered that "International Sanketic Vasha Dibas" was celebrated first by Sanmilito Jatipunjya in 1951 to include all in the main stream in inclusion. NSOU is also trying to make the mission successful. Dr. Panigrahi added that the first school for deaf was established in 18th century at America.


Topic: - Sign Language and Inclusivity




