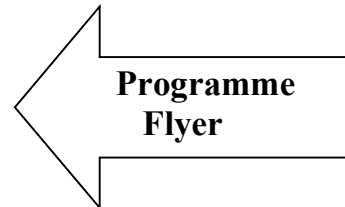

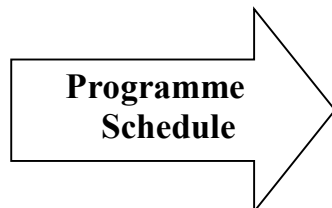

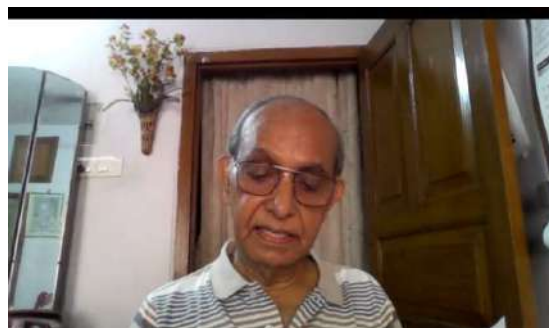
Welcome Address

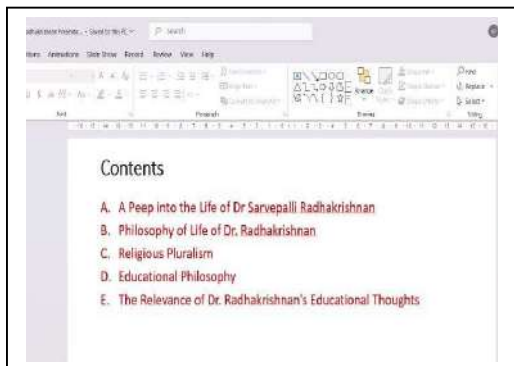
Introduction of the speakers

Prof. Debi Prosad Nag Chowdhury, Dept. of Education, SoE, at the outset, conveyed his respects to the great teacher, Dr. Sarvepalli Radhakrishnan and all his teachers starting from his primary education up to the university, from whom he learned something. He introduced the invited speakers of the programme and made the participants acquainted with the versatile aspects and achievements of Prof. Nityananda Pradhan, RIE, Bhubaneswar and Dr. Minara Yeasmin, Asst. Professor, Dept. of Education, Aliah University, along with their short biographies and field of activities & interests in the field of Education.



Speech – 1

Prof. Nityananda Pradhan, RIE, Bhubaneswar, delivered his lecture on **“Educational Philosophy of Dr. Radhakrishnan”**. At first he peeped into the family life of Dr. Radhakrishnan and then into his philosophy of life. Thereafter he nicely elaborated the metaphysical states with intuitive apprehension, where integral experience reveals the sum of perceptual and logical thoughts & ideas. Religious pluralism w.r.t. educational philosophy was also delineated by him. Then he discussed in detail the meaning of education, aims of education, role of teachers and discipline in the context of recommendations of national education, envisaged in Radhakrishnan Commission, 1949. He also expressed his views of education at different levels – primary, secondary and higher education.



Speech – 2



Dr. Minara Yeasmin, Asst. Professor, Dept. of Education, Aliah University delivered her lecture on “**Perspectives of Teachers’ Day Celebration in India and the World**”. She focused on the perspectives of execution of educational aspects, since 19th century, with special reference to teaching-learning dimensions, educational implementation, teaching methods & teacher-student relationship. She discussed about the sequential development and gradual changes of thoughts and ideas in education and its relevance in the context of the society. She stated the contribution of Savitribai Phule (1831-1897) – first female teacher, Rabindranath Tagore (1861-1941) and APJ Abdul Kalam (1931-2015) in education. The gradual sequential changes from the 19th century to 21st century in the field of education, were also emphasized by her with the the exploration of research and enquiry, creativity & innovation, capability & technology, etc. She mentioned and explained the perspectives of Teachers’ Day celebration in the world.
