#### Preview:

**Helen Adams Keller** (June 27, 1880 – June 1, 1968) was an American author, disability rights advocate, political activist and lecturer. Born in West Tuscumbia, Alabama, she lost her sight and her hearing after a bout of illness when she was 19 months old. She then communicated primarily using home signs until the age of seven, when she met her first teacher and life-long companion Anne Sullivan. Sullivan taught Keller language, including reading and writing. After an education at both specialist and mainstream schools, Keller attended Radcliffe College of Harvard University and became the first deaf blind person in the United States to earn a Bachelor of Arts degree.

Madam Keller was also a prolific author, writing 14 books and hundreds of speeches and essays on topics ranging from animals to Mahatma Gandhi Keller campaigned for those with disabilities, for women's suffrage, labor rights, and world peace. In 1909, she joined the Socialist Party of America. She was a founding member of the American Civil Liberties Union.

Hellen keller was born in 27<sup>th</sup> June 1880 & died in 1<sup>st</sup> June 1968. She lost her sight & hearing due to illness at the age of 19 months. Her First book is the story of my life published in (1903). She wrote 14 books.

She was graduated from Radcliffe college (B.A. in Arts) of Harverd College in 1904.and became the first Deaf Blind person in the unite states. She came to India to meet Rabindra Nath Tagore whom she respected as Guru. She enjoyed the song sang by R.N. Tagore through touching his lips & tongue.

She stepped 40 countries all over the world for the person with PwD.

Prof. Mukhopadhyay discussed so many achievements of Hellen Keller specially for education & Rehabilitation effort for PwDs..

She tries to speak & uttered the word 'water' at first. She used to communicate with other person by keeping her finger on that person's lip & touching his tongue. Dr. Mukhopadhyay discussed so many topics regarding Hellen Keller.

At the end of his discourse, some evaluative feedback was received.

The one-hour speech was fascinating and really educational.
