Celebrating International Day of Education: Students Speak

Background: Education is a human right, a public good and a public responsibility.

The United Nations General Assembly proclaimed 24 January as International Day of Education, in celebration of the role of education for peace and development. Without inclusive and equitable quality education and lifelong opportunities for all, countries will not succeed in achieving gender equality and breaking the cycle of poverty that is leaving millions of children, youth and adults behind.

Celebrating the fourth International Day of Education under the theme "Changing Course, Transforming Education" became imperative. As it was detailed in UNESCO's recent global Futures of Education report, transforming the future requires an urgent rebalancing of our relationships with each other, with nature as well as with technology that permeates our lives, bearing breakthrough opportunities while raising serious concerns for equity, inclusion and democratic participation.

With this background, as a part of celebrating NSOU's 25 years of existence, SoE jubilantly organized to commemorate International Day of Education on 24th of January, 2022, the Monday through students (of all programmes under SoE and CDSER) presentation and deliberation on the theme mandated by UNESCO from 2PM to 4PM in online mode.


The sequence of sessions is described briefly:
