#### PROGRAMME REPORT

**Prelude:** The two-day International Symposium on "Education 5.0: Expected Roles of Teachers & Learners" was organized by the Department of Education, School of Education (SOE) at Netaji Subhas Open University (NSOU). The event took place on August 22nd and 23rd, 2025, at the Kalyani Regional Centre, NSOU. The symposium aimed to examine the implications of Education 5.0 on the roles of both teachers and learners in an era of rapid technological advancements and evolving societal needs.

**Key Themes & Objectives:** The symposium focused on how education is shifting beyond simple technology integration to a human-centric approach that develops crucial skills for a future-ready society. Key topics included innovation, critical thinking, creativity, collaboration, and digital literacy. The symposium's main objectives were to:

- Explore the conceptual framework of Education 5.0 and its practical implications.
- **Identify the emerging roles** of teachers as facilitators, mentors, and innovators.
- Analyze the evolving expectations of learners, emphasizing their active participation and self-directed learning.
- **Discuss innovative pedagogies** and assessment strategies aligned with Education 5.0 principles.
- Foster interdisciplinary collaboration among educators, researchers, and policymakers.
- **Showcase research and best practices** related to Education 5.0 from both national and international perspectives.

**Participants & attendees**: Around 75. The event welcomed a diverse audience, including academicians, researchers, teachers, and PhD scholars, with encouraging contributions on themes like the teacher as a facilitator and learner agency.

#### **Program Highlights**

#### Day 1: August 22, 2025

The first day kicked off with an inaugural session including lamp lighting, a welcome address by Dr. Papiya Upadhyay, Convener of the symposium, Prof. Sibaprasad De outlining the theme of the event and a presidential address by Prof. D.P. Nag Chowdhury, Director of SOE, NSOU.

- **Keynote Address:** Prof. K. Ferreira-Meyers of the University of Eswatini presented on "The polyglot architect: reimagining language education in education 5.0 with AI as catalyst".
- **Guest of Honour Address:** Prof. Pradeep Kumar Misra, Director, (CPRHE-NIEPA), New Delhi, spoke on a "Human-centric Approach in the era of Education 5.0".
- Vote of Thanks: Dr. Parimal Sarkar, Jt. Convener of the symposium proposed the motion of thanks.
- **Plenary Session:** Prof. Bijan Sarkar from the University of Kalyani delivered a talk on the "Modern Learning Ecosystem in Education 5.0".

The afternoon featured two technical sessions with presentations on topics such as the role of metacognition, psychological well-being in Education 5.0, and the use of AI tools in learning.

#### Day 2: August 23, 2025





- Valedictory Session: Prof. Asheesh Srivastava, from IUCTE-BHU, Varanasi, gave the valedictory address titled "The Metamorphosis of Education: Cultivating Human Potential in the 5.0 Era". The symposium concluded with feedback from participants and certificate distribution
- Certificate Distribution: Participants and presenters were provided respective certificates for their spirited contribution and participation/presentation.


